A postdoctoral training position is available in the [laboratory](#) of [Amyl Habib, M.D.](#), to study Cancer Biology in the Department of Neurology at UT Southwestern Medical Center.

Our laboratory focuses on the following major areas of research.

1. Mechanisms of resistance to targeted treatment in glioblastoma, lung and other cancers.
2. Synthetic lethal interactions in receptor tyrosine kinase signaling.
3. Mechanisms regulating invasion and proliferation in glioblastoma. We are particularly interested in translational studies that can be transitioned rapidly into clinical trials.
